Love (God's love)

g0025. ἀγαπάω agapaō; perhaps from ἄγαν agan (much) (or compare h5689); to love (in a social or moral sense): — (be-)love(-ed). Compare 5368.

Love

g0026. ἀγάπη agapē; from 25; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast: — (feast of) charity(-ably), dear, love.

AV (116) - love 86, charity 27, dear 1, charitably + g2596 1, feast of charity 1;

1. brotherly love, affection, good will, love, benevolence
2. love feasts

Beloved

g0027. ἀγαπητός agapētos; from 25; beloved: — (dearly, well) beloved, dear.

AV (62) - beloved 47, dearly beloved 9, well beloved 3, dear 3;

beloved, esteemed, dear, favourite, worthy of love

Affectionate Love

g5368. φιλέω phileō; from 5384; to be a friend to (fond of (an individual or an object)), i.e. have affection for (denoting personal attachment, as a matter of sentiment or feeling; while 25 is wider, embracing especially the judgment and the deliberate assent of the will as a matter of principle, duty and propriety: the two thus stand related very much as 2309 and 1014, or as 2372 and 3563 respectively; the former being chiefly of the heart and the latter of the head); specially, to kiss (as a mark of tenderness): — kiss, love.

Brotherly love

g5360. φιλαδελφία philadelphia; from 5361; fraternal affection: — brotherly love (kindness), love of the brethren.

AV (6) - brotherly love 3, brotherly kindness 2, love of the brethren 1;

1. love of brothers or sisters, brotherly love
2. in the NT the love which Christians cherish for each other as brethren

h0157. אָהַב 'âhab; or אֶהֱב 'aheb; a primitive root; to have affection for (sexually or otherwise): — (be-)love(-d, -ly, -r), like, friend.

AV (208) - love 169, lover(s) 19, friend(s) 12, beloved 5, liketh 1, lovely 1, loving 1;
